Maintenance Matters

There continues to be a backlog of maintenance requests, but we are diligently working through them with Dale Ferguson, REI and Bay City Builders. If you have submitted a request and it has not yet been addressed, be assured we are making every effort to get to all requests. Please remember to submit a Maintenance Request Form – this is the only way work requests can be processed and tracked. I have been approached by several residents who have guestioned why their requests have not been addressed and it was identified that they did not complete a Maintenance Request Form, but rather "told someone", so they were never identified as having an issue.

One of the major ongoing issues Involves window replacements. Supply chain issues continue, with windows taking months to arrive and then we must arrange with REI for installation. I was informed by ABC

Supply that 8 windows have arrived. Although this may not be optimal weather, REI will be completing the installation of these within the next few weeks. A number of window requests has come in for next year, from which a list for evaluation and replacements is being generated.

Another project is the restoration of the pond pump house. The Board decided to repair the wood rot, clad the building in vinyl siding, reconfigure the roof, and straighten the leaning fence. This project is being completed by Bay City Builders.

Next year we will be completing our annual building maintenance, trim painting, power washing, etc. Additionally, with the oversight by Dave Peters, the contract was signed with Ultimate Exteriors for scheduled roof replacements.
