Get ready to fire up that dehumidifier in your basement to keep mold, mildew, and funky smells at bay.

Remember to set your clocks forward an hour on March 12th.

MAINENANCE REPORT

As we all know, Michigan is famous for many things, beautiful Great Lakes, Mackinaw Island Fudge, Motown and POT HOLES. Yes, we are not immune to the havoc that mother nature causes our road surfaces. I am sure that you have all noticed that there are several areas which will be addressed when the weather permits, but please be careful when walking!! I know some of our hearty residents are out early when light might be limited, and we certainly do not want any injuries!

During the winter months, it is extremely difficult to complete requests which would require workers to brave the elements. That being said, we have been able to address some of the issues with windows, doors and sashes – this will continue as the weather improves.

Planning for upcoming roof replacements, under the guidance of Dave Peters, has been completed and will be starting in later spring. Discussion with REI is being completed specific to the installation of windows which were ordered last year, arrived late in the season and will be installed soon. The annual activities of trim painting, deck power washing and staining will also be occurring, so it will be a busy time for all of us.

Reminder: please read the Cortland Farms Rules and Regulations. It is imperative that we all work together to maintain our complex as the premier condominium residence in Bay County.

Smoke detector batteries – even though this might be a little early, please remember to change the batteries, usually I do it with the time change!

SPRINKLER/POND/IRRIGATION UPDATES

Mike Panknin – Director for Ponds/Sprinklers

The sprinkler wagon is ready to go.

During the Fall 2022 shutdown. I found four sprinklers that were damaged during mowing operation. They were flagged and work orders started. A complete sprinkler line along the east side of the north pond was damaged during installation of a generator by condo owner vendor. Once repaired I will be able to test and certify operation. The cost for repairs will be covered by condoowners vendor insurance.

Our 2023 lawn sprinkler watering schedule will operate the same as last year. If you are new to Cortland Farms (Welcome) and not sure when the sprinklers run/happen call me or stop me when you see me in the area. Our spring startup will tell us about our winter damage. I will be checking areas as I start up and during testing for sprinkler/valve operation. A few pine trees were removed last year, the parts were ordered so the sprinklers can be moved and relocated for better coverage.



Our sprinkler/pond contracts for 2023 have been signed. Licenses were applied for. We have also discussed with our pond/weed vendor a treatment program to control our

weed growth in the North and South Pond.

I am estimating our sprinkler start up for the end of April to Mid-May. I am waiting for tentative schedule from vendor. Our fountains will be installed Mid-May

The fence surrounding the pump house is scheduled to be painted.

Thanks to everyone for reporting when the sprinkler's act up or create a stuck spray.
